## **Dear Premier**

## Crimes Amendment (Zoe's Law) Bill (No 2) 2013

- 1. We refer to our correspondence dated 11 November 2014 in relation to the Crimes Amendment (Zoe's Law) Bill (No 2) 2013 (Bill).
- 2. We understand since then the Christian Democrats have proposed an amendment to the Bill of a two-year sunset clause.
- 3. Women's Legal Services NSW continues to maintain a strong opposition to the passage of the Bill. The proposed amendment does not address our concerns.
- 4. In particular, imposing a sunset clause in no way ameliorates our fundamental concerns about the potential implications of changing the legal status of a foetus.
- 5. We are opposed to the unwanted and invasive scrutiny of individual women who have experienced miscarriage, stillbirth or foetal harm as a result of a criminal act which could result from this Bill.
- 6. We are further concerned by developments reported in the United States where pregnant women have been deprived of their liberty in a range of circumstances due to the prioritising of the foetus over the rights of the woman.<sup>1</sup>
- 7. We acknowledge the tremendous sadness and grief that accompanies the loss of a pregnancy, particularly in the later stages of gestation. However, we believe that this is not a sufficient or appropriate reason to alter the definition of legal personhood. Harm to or destruction of a foetus is always an injury to the pregnant woman. To resile from this and recognise the independent rights of a foetus in certain circumstances carries a clear risk of eroding access to abortion services and the rights of women.
